DISASTER PREPAREDNESS FOR PETS

- 1. Check ahead of time which hotels along your evacuation route will accept pets. Also know which friends, relatives or boarding facilities can care for your pets.

 2. Have secure carriers, collars and leashes for each pet. Train your pets to become familiar with their carriers, the carrier will become a secure and comforting
 - refuge if your pet is required to travel or live in it after a storm.
 - 3. Make sure all pet vaccinations are up to date and current rabies tags are on collars.
- 4. Photograph each pet and include photos with your immunization and other medical records, store in a waterproof container. Most places will NOT accept pets without proof of vaccinations.
 - 5. HAVE YOUR PET MICROCHIPPED! Collars can easily come off.
 - 6. Supplies to have on hand for evacuation include: pet food, water, bowls, can opener, trash bags, cat litter, toys, comfort items and any pet medications.

 Remember, if you must evacuate, plan to take your pet with you! IF IT IS NOT SAFE FOR YOU, IT IS NOT SAFE FOR YOUR PET!
